United World Colleges (UWC) is an international education movement. At 18 schools and colleges worldwide, students from over 50 nations experience a unique education which combines academic discoveries with extra-curricular activities. This concept enables our graduates to face the principle challenges of our times such as climate change, healthcare access and societal cohesion.

STUDENT SELECTIONS BASED ON TALENT ENSURE DIVERSITY IN ALL ITS FORMS

Contrary to many other independent schools, UWC is looking for talented teenagers independent of where and how they are living and what their parents can afford financially. Who is admitted to UWC is solely based on their motivation, aptitude and their involvement in social causes. Partial and full scholarships are offered where necessary. Thereby ensuring a socioeconomic and cultural diversity at UWC schools that goes far beyond nationality or religion.

EMBRACING THE DIFFERENCES THAT MAKE UP OUR WORLD

SUSTAINABLE EDUCATION AN HOLISTIC EDUCATIONAL APPROACH FOR A BETTER WORLD

The founding father of the UWC movement was the German pedagogue Kurt Hahn (1886–1974). Kurt Hahn experienced two World Wars, fascism and emigration. The experiences of his time manifested themselves in his educational ideals: young people should be taught more than just academic knowledge. Hahn thought personal responsibility, social service, and international understanding were just as important.

VALUES OF THE UNITED NATIONS AS A GUIDELINE

As a response to the Cold War between East and West Kurt Hahn developed a unique schooling concept: the United World Colleges. Until today, the educational movement remains committed to Kurt Hahn's vision. The values of the United Nations (UN) are its basis. The 17 goals for sustainable development (SDG) to which all UN member states committed themselves in 2015 are central to UWC's mission. Here, sustainability encompasses both economic and social dimensions, as well as environmental aspects.

FOUNDATIONAL WORK WITH IMPACT THE GERMAN UWC FOUNDATION

For 50 years, students from Germany have been attending the United World Colleges. The German foundation is one of over 150 national committees in charge of selecting, financing and taking care of German teenagers attending UWC before and during their time at the schools and colleges.

THE FOUNDATION DEPENDS ON THE COMMITMENT OF VOLUNTEERS

The foundation depends on the commitment of volunteers who form the board and the selection committee. Numerous UWC alumni are particularly involved in actively supporting the German UWC foundation. The German UWC foundation is also actively engaged in the international UWC context. It is an important supporter of UWC Mostar, Bosnia and Herzegovina and representatives of the German UWC foundation are also working in different UWC International committees.

SUSTAINABILITY AS A MAIN FOCUS AT UWC ROBERT BOSCH COLLEGE

The German UWC Foundation, together with the Robert Bosch Foundation, is a shareholder of UWC Robert Bosch College, which opened in September 2014. At the campus in Freiburg, 50 German students learn and live together. The remaining 150 places are filled by international students. The focal points of the college – as is suitable to the location of Freiburg – are topics like environment, sustainability, and resource respecting technologies.

SHARING EDUCATION FAIRLY UWC SHORT COURSES

UWC Short Courses offer teenagers the possibility to experience UWC's educational approach in a more compact form. The goal: making education a uniting force. The one to five-week long courses take place all over the world. In response to the pandemic, UWC Germany has further developed and tested moving its UWC Short Course online.

WHO WILL HELP ME TO CHANGE THE WORLD?

Youth Leadership, sustainability, gender identity, migration – the topics covered by UWC Short Courses are as diverse as the young people participating. Together they reflect on their role in society. How can I get involved? How can I change the world? And who is going to support me? All participants are encouraged to develop their own projects and push them forward at home.

UWC SPIRIT FOR ALL

To allow all interested students to participate in a UWC Short Course, independent of the financial means of their parents, the German UWC foundation supports course fees and travel costs with full and partial scholarships where necessary. Since 2009, the German UWC foundation has also been offering Short Courses in Germany for young people who cannot or do not want to travel far. These courses are also supported by the foundation via scholarships. The diversity of the participants is therefore great.
